VI. Qualification of Competitors and Horses

All NF's, including the host nation, are responsible to certify that riders and horses entered by them in international events are correctly qualified in accordance with all the requirements of the Rules.

All qualifying events must be identified, and any national events must be certified as of at least the equivalent standard of difficulty as the relevant international star level of competition.

The Technical Delegate or his nominee shall check that all horses and riders starting at all International events are properly certified as qualified by their NF or duly exempted in accordance with this article.

QRs for CIOs, CCI and CICs must be obtained in the calendar year in question or the 2 preceding calendar years. The deadline for obtaining the final CIC/CNC QR is 2 weeks before the first Dressage day of the event unless an earlier date is specified in the Schedule. The deadline for obtaining the CCI QR is 4 weeks before the first dressage day of the event unless an earlier date is specified in the Schedule.

Qualifications may be achieved as a combination or separately by rider and horse.

Where a QR at a CIC is specified, one QR at a CCI of the same level is equally acceptable.

The following qualifying results have to be achieved:

- ☞ not more than 20 penalties at obstacles on the Cross Country Test as well as
- ☞ not more than 90 seconds exceeding the optimum Cross Country time as well as

B. Grooms

Accommodation and meals will be at the cost of the competitors.

The OC provides sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

C. Horses

Horses will be stabled in permanent boxes on the competition site, € 100,- per box, first bedding included. Stables must be requested and paid by closing date of entries. Forage, hay and straw can also be purchased at customary prices on the competition site. No own stable tents are allowed!

D. Caravans/Trucks

Current supply will be made available for caravans or trucks with electricity, a fee of € 50,- per truck will be charged for the whole event and has to be paid when handing in the entries.

E. Welcome

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

F. Advertising and publicity on competitors and horses

Name, stud book, initials/breed and registration number, country of birth, year of birth, sex, colour, FEI passport number, name(s) of owner(s), name of sire and dam.

Foreign entries are not accepted unless they contain full details according to FEI requirements.

2. Veterinary Aspects A

Veterinary examinations, horse inspections and passport controls

These will be carried out in accordance with veterinary regulations, Art. 1011,

Rules for Three day event, Art. 518, General Regulations, 21st edition 2005 will apply:

Art. 511.2.1:

All horses must be registered with the F.E.I

Art. 511.2.2:

Every horse entered at CCNs, CICs1/2* and CCIs1*/2 in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CICs3* and CCIs3/4*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an Official FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 511.2.3:

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs1/2* and CCIs1/2* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as mentioned in Paragraph 2.2 above. All such horses must be properly registered with their NF and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

A Veterinary Examination with Passport Control should be carried out before any jumping effort has taken place. The rider has the responsibility to contact the Veterinary Delegate to arrange the examination. Fitness to compete will be assessed during the Dressage Test; in the event that this is deemed to be unsatisfactory further examination by the Veterinary Delegate may be required.

Equine Influenza Vaccination, (Vet.-Regl. Appendix VII)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI passport or a national passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 month and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both, primary and first, and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturers instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

Standard sampling procedure for prohibited substances (Vet.-Regl. Kap. V + VI, Anhang IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3/4*, CCIOs, Worldcup Qualifiers and -Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CCIs/CICs sampling is recommended. In CCIs3/4* the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1017.4).

Medication Control Program (Group I & II only)

Competitors at CCIs, CCIOs, Championships and Games must pay the equivalent of 12,50 SFr per horse per event to the Organizer Committee towards the cost of the above programme.

Approved Laboratory (Art.1022 and App. I.4)

Under the Medication Control Program (MCP) in Groups I and II (Western Europe), all samples collected in accordance with VR Art., 1017.1, will be analysed by the Laboratoire Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, 91370 Verrières le Buisson, France, Tel.: +33.1 - 69 75 28 28, Fax: +33.1 - 69 75 28 29.

Health Certificates

At the time of the first horse examination, i.e. on arrival of the horses on the show venue and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event:

- a) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of Annex B of the directive 90/426 EEC in the currently valid issue (see attached specimen)
- b) if the competitor comes from a third country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of Annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the currently valid issue.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy. The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents. Besides questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

XI. Miscellaneous:

1. Protests

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of SFR 150,- or equivalent.

2. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. Settlement will be done per competitor. Each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

3. Insurances

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The organiser also declines any responsibility for theft, damages, fire and other incidents, unless the organiser can be accused of gross negligence or intent.

4. Medical Card (Annex 8 of rules for Eventing)

OCs must draw the attention of all competitors that they must carry a medical card easily accessible (see Annex I of this Check List) for the Cross-Country Test. medical Cards must be collected by the OC upon arrival to the competition and checked by the official doctor and the TD.

5. Event's Organisation

In exceptional circumstances with the approval of the Ground Jury, the competitors and the NF-Delegate, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the foreign judge.

6. Stable Security

The regulations for stable security and stewarding which are laid down in FEI VR Art. 1005.2.4, 1005.2.5.1 und 1005.2.5.2 do not apply for this CIC1* und CIC2*.

7. Head Numbers

Each competitor himself is responsible for head numbers. Numbers for the back of the riders will be made available against a rental fee of € 20,00.

Code of Conduct

Die FEI erwartet von allen im internationalen Turniersport beteiligten Personen, den Code of Conduct der FEI zu befolgen. Sie erwartet des weiteren stets das Wohlergehen des Pferdes als oberstes Gebot anzuerkennen und zu akzeptieren und es niemals wettbewerbsmäßigen oder kommerziellen Einflüssen unterzuordnen.

1. Bei der Vorbereitung und beim Training der Turnierpferde muss zu jeder Zeit das Wohlergehen der Pferde absolute Priorität haben. Das umfasst eine gute Behandlung der Pferde, gute Trainingsmethoden und Hufpflege, gute Ausrüstung sowie guten Transport.
2. Bevor Pferden und Teilnehmern erlaubt wird, am Wettkampf teilzunehmen, muss sichergestellt sein, dass sie in gutem Gesundheitszustand sind und dass der Ausbildungs- und Trainingszustand dem jeweiligen Prüfungsniveau entspricht und sie somit fit sind. Das bezieht sich u. a. auf den Gebrauch von Medikamenten, operative Eingriffe, die das Wohlergehen oder die Sicherheit gefährden, auf den Einsatz trächtiger Stuten oder den unsachgemäßen Gebrauch von Hilfsmitteln.
3. Durch den Turniereinsatz darf das Wohlergehen des Pferdes nicht beeinträchtigt werden. D. h. es muss besonders acht gegeben werden auf Prüfungsplätze, Bodenverhältnisse, Witterungsbedingungen, Stallungen und die Sicherheit auf dem Turniergelände. Ferner muss sich das Pferd für den Weitertransport in einem guten Gesundheitszustand befinden.
4. Es muss sichergestellt sein, dass Pferde nach dem Turniereinsatz sorgfältig gepflegt werden. Kein Aufwand darf gescheut werden, um sicher zu stellen, dass Pferde nach Beendigung ihrer „Turnierkarriere“ weiterhin fürsorglich behandelt werden. Das umfasst gute veterinärmedizinische Versorgung, u. a. von Sportverletzungen, Euthanasie und den „Ruhestand“.
5. Die FEI bittet alle am Sport Beteiligten eindringlich, das höchste Niveau der Ausbildung auf ihren entsprechenden Spezialgebieten anzustreben.
